Chapter Three

Jesse Egbert Carroll (1889-1960)

Jesse Egbert Carroll (Figure 25) was the eldest of the five children of Jesse T. and Harriet Croffut Carroll. The Egbert name has no precedent in the Carroll line and most




Figure 26: 1908 Broome County Colesville Township Historical & 2016 Map Overlay

likely honors his mother's father Egbert Joseph Croffut. Jesse was born January 11, 1889 in the Town of Colesville located in Broome County NY¹⁰³, ¹⁰⁴. His father had a farm¹⁰⁵ (Figure 26) of about 44 acres located not far from Sanitaria Springs and Colesville. As a matter of fact all early Carroll ancestors lived in this region and a good many of the descendents still do. Bert resided at this farm until he was in his early 20's106,107,108,109. There are not many photos of Jesse Egbert who went by the
